



## St. Louis Hills SBD encourages resident participation

As we began 2026, the St. Louis Hills Special Business District (SBD) said goodbye and thank you to two founding board members who finished their terms—Tom Bene and Brian Hoeltge. They were instrumental in the development and formation of the SBD and we are very grateful for their service to our community! With those departures, we welcomed Kevin Kozminske and Chip Kastner on to the board—both Kevin and Chip have been deeply involved in the neighborhood for years and we are fortunate to have them join us!

As of this writing, while there are no “major” projects pending, we continue to fund important projects that help to make the neighborhood the safe and livable place that we all love. The SBD is also discussing additional project funding opportunities in 2026, including collaborations with the City and other neighborhood organizations. Right now, the SBD has been or is involved in:

- The completion of the new midblock crosswalks on all four sides of Francis Park, which was funded in 2025.
- Putting out an RFP for the landscaping for two public areas: the crosswalk garden beds at Nottingham & Childress; and the island area at Donovan & Jamieson. The RFP includes the design, planting, and ongoing maintenance of these two areas.
- Supporting the annual Easter Egg Hunt along with the SLHNA.
- Ongoing nightly police officer patrols by The City’s Finest.

Going forward, the SBD will assist with a road update of Jamieson between Chippewa and Hampton—likely in 2027—but dependent on the City’s schedule. We continue to work not only with the SLHNA, but also with Friends of Francis Park, Friends of Willmore Park, and other local organizations as they come up with valuable projects to bring to life.

Three other things should be mentioned with regard to the SBD are monthly meetings, funding requests and general

information about what is going on in the SBD:

### Monthly Meeting:

The Board of Commissioners meets every month on the third Wednesday of the month. Locations may change and are noted on the website ([www.stlhillssbd.com](http://www.stlhillssbd.com)), with the preferred locations as Buder Library.

Meeting materials for each meeting are also accessible on the website by following the link next to the time of each meeting. We encourage you to attend our meetings and stay informed about issues affecting the district.

### Funding Requests:

Anyone with a viable idea/project can submit a funding request by going to the SBD website ([www.stlhillssbd.com](http://www.stlhillssbd.com)). Go to the “Funding Request” tab and follow the instructions. The more detail you include (i.e. area, scope, potential cost, etc.), the easier it is to assess and understand, and we’ll certainly want you or your group to present the idea at a meeting. ### General Information:

We’re often asked about updates on various projects or reports from our security company. You can find all this information on our web site as well. # Run for the Hills turns 35

Now is the perfect time to start preparing for the 35th Annual Run for the Hills, taking place at 8:00 a.m. on Saturday, September 19. The 1-mile youth race and 1-mile walk will follow at 9:00 a.m.

Thirty-five years is a remarkable milestone for any event. I'm incredibly grateful for the continued support from our neighborhood, sponsors, and the running community that has sustained this event for so long.

Since its beginning in 1991, Run for the Hills has been the number one fundraiser for Francis Park. It's hard to imagine what our park would look like today without the impact of this race and the dedication of our volunteers. I hope you'll consider participating this year—as a runner, walker, volunteer, or sponsor.

I'd also like to share an important reminder about the event. While we've been fortunate to avoid major mishaps over the past 35 years, safety must always remain our top priority—for our runners, walkers, and volunteers alike.

In my fifteen years as race director, I've come to expect one particular concern each year: impatient drivers attempting to enter the race course. The possibility of someone getting hurt because a driver is unwilling to take a detour keeps race organizers up at night.

We recognize that street closures can be inconvenient, and we deeply appreciate the many residents who plan ahead by moving their vehicles outside course boundaries the night before or early the morning of the race. Your cooperation makes a tremendous difference.

As we look ahead to September 19, here are a few important reminders:

- Zero tolerance for unsafe driving: Drivers who attempt to bypass road closures or enter the course will be reported to the 2nd District Police, who will be present during the event.
- Support our volunteers: The individuals stationed at street closures are there for one reason—to keep our runners and walkers safe. They are giving their time to serve the community. Please treat them with kindness and respect.
- Advance notice is provided: Every home within the course boundaries receives written notification 1–2 weeks prior to the event, allowing ample time to plan ahead.
- Celebrate the impact: This race has raised hundreds of thousands of dollars for the beautification of Francis Park—something our entire neighborhood can be proud of.

Here's to a safe, enjoyable, and spirited Run for the Hills—filled with good cheer, patience, and maybe even a few personal records.

# SLHNA scholarship application deadline is April 29

Membership in the St. Louis Hills Neighborhood Association (SLHNA) is an excellent way to contribute to the camaraderie of our beautiful neighborhood. Another great benefit of membership is eligibility for our annual scholarship competition.

Any child or legal dependent of a SLHNA member is eligible to apply for the one-time scholarship based upon the following criteria:

- The member lives within the boundaries of St. Louis Hills
- The member's household has two

current and consecutive years of paid SLHNA membership

- The applicant is at least an eighth grade student
- The applicant is attending or planning to attend an educational institution (public high school, private high school, trade school, technical school, vocational school, two-year college, four-year college/university, PhD/Med School/Law School/Fellow program, and so forth)

Two one-time scholarships of \$750 will be awarded.

The Scholarship Chairs will receive completed applications. Personal information will be redacted. The redacted applications will then be reviewed by a panel of judges, who will select two scholarship recipients.

The two recipients selected by the judges will be contacted directly by email by the end of May. Updates to the Association's website and social media will also announce the selected recipients.

We oversee essential functions including accounting, financial reporting, payroll, and the processing of city payments, acting as careful stewards of taxpayer dollars.

# Jefferson City update

Happy Spring, St. Louis Hills! We have made it through the winter months and are once again approaching the season where our district and neighborhood shines with the most amount of visitors and events that allow us to showcase the hard work of our volunteers and beauty of what city living can and should be. Thank you to all of those who continue to pour in countless hours to make our community shine.

As I write this update, we are halfway through our session in Jefferson City. While we do not yet know what has or has not been signed by the Governor, I can update everyone on what has passed the House and awaits Senate approval. The Governor's number one priority is the elimination of the state income tax. If passed by the senate and signed in its current state by the Governor, it would then go to a vote of the people, most likely in November. The proposal would take the already very low state income tax and gradually phase it out to be replaced with an expanded and raised sales tax. Some estimates note that state sales tax would need to be raised as high as 9% to replace the state's operating budget at current levels. This would lead to an increased tax rate for seniors and about 85% of Missourians given current state tax brackets and income levels. I will be sure to keep everyone up to date in my bi-

weekly newsletter and social media updates.

There are also a number of historic and state tax credit bills moving through the house that would be extremely beneficial for many of the buildings in downtown St. Louis. These would greatly aid in the renovation and restoration of decaying buildings and office towers that business groups would like to turn into mixed-use and family orientated living spaces to increase foot traffic and our downtown population. There is still a long way to go before we see construction begin on these former office spaces but the more cranes we can get in the air to revitalize downtown the better.

As always, my goal is to represent the people of the 82nd district, our shared values, and work to get meaningful things accomplished for the City of St. Louis. Ensuring that our government entities can function efficiently to deliver progress, which I believe will help grow the region, is always my number one priority. We must think regionally and row in the same direction in order to reverse the population loss our City has suffered in recent decades.

I hope to see many of you in district and at our parks this spring and summer!

# Join Friends of Francis Park and help keep our park beautiful

As many of you know, Friends of Francis Park is a not-for-profit organization formed more than 10 years ago to help keep Francis Park looking its best. It is run by neighborhood volunteers and supports park maintenance and beautification projects, and sponsors park events.

Over the years, we have planted dozens if not hundreds of native Missouri trees in the park to restore the canopy. We have hired contractors to take down dangerous dead trees and remove fallen branches from the park. We sponsor the lily pond and corner garden plantings. We built the gazebo and native plant garden, which attracts monarch butterflies and pollinators to the park. We raised money to design and build the David Francis statue and contributed substantially to the cost of the new playground equipment that was installed last year. We hire landscapers to mow the park and edge the sidewalks for park events every fall. We sponsor park clean-ups in the spring and fall of each year. We hire workers each summer to water plants, pick

up trash and work on other maintenance projects. Last year, with the support of the SBD we restored the handball courts, which were not in good condition.

We also sponsor various park events, which raise money for the park, such as Run for the Hills, the Footgolf Tournament and Art in the Park.

All of this would not be possible without the support of our generous members and volunteers. We offer memberships at the \$100 level for families, and at the \$50 and \$30 level for individuals. - application found on the Association's website
- Provide a list of any academic honors and/or extracurricular activities
- Write and submit an essay of 150 words or less answering the question "How have you contributed to making Saint Louis Hills a better place to live?"
- Provide a 3rd quarter/2nd trimester report card
- Submit two - three reference letters.

The application deadline is April 29, 2026, which is a Wednesday. The completed application and related documents must be postmarked by that date. No electronic submissions will be considered.

The monetary award will be distributed by September 9th,

2026 and made payable to each recipient's educational institution, not to the recipient directly.

We ask that the selected applicants provide a recent picture for our newsletter and attend the June 18th 2026 SLHNA meeting to receive award certificates.

to your garden this year, consider planting  
flowers that support pollinators like bees  
and butterflies. These little visitors play
